<b>WOLF ROCK</b>	Faith - For how she is taking responsibility for getting herself into a positive mindset to be ready to learn at the start of each day. Well done!

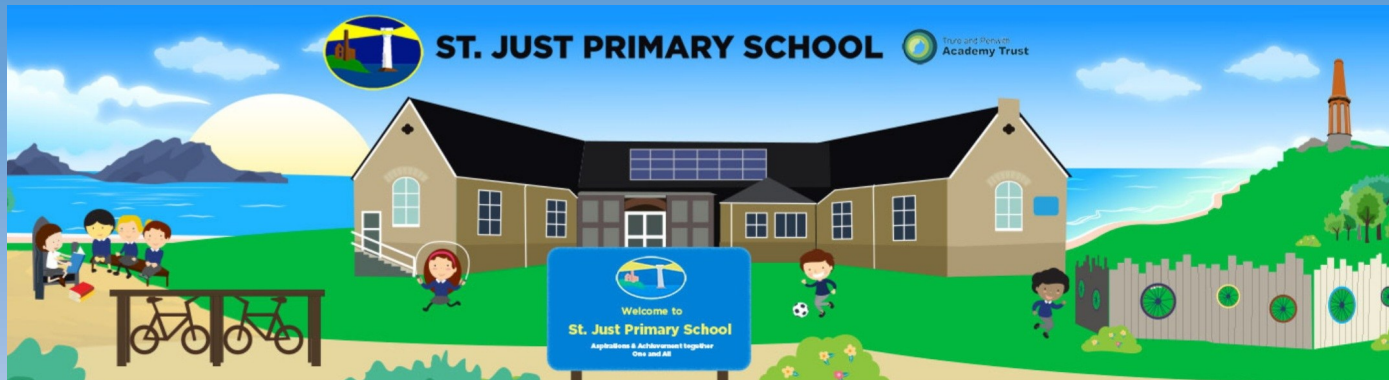

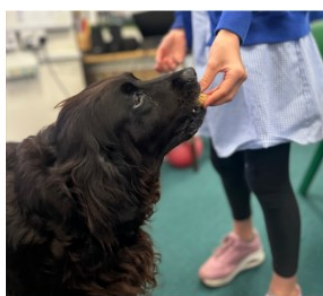




# Introducing our Head Boy and Head Girl...

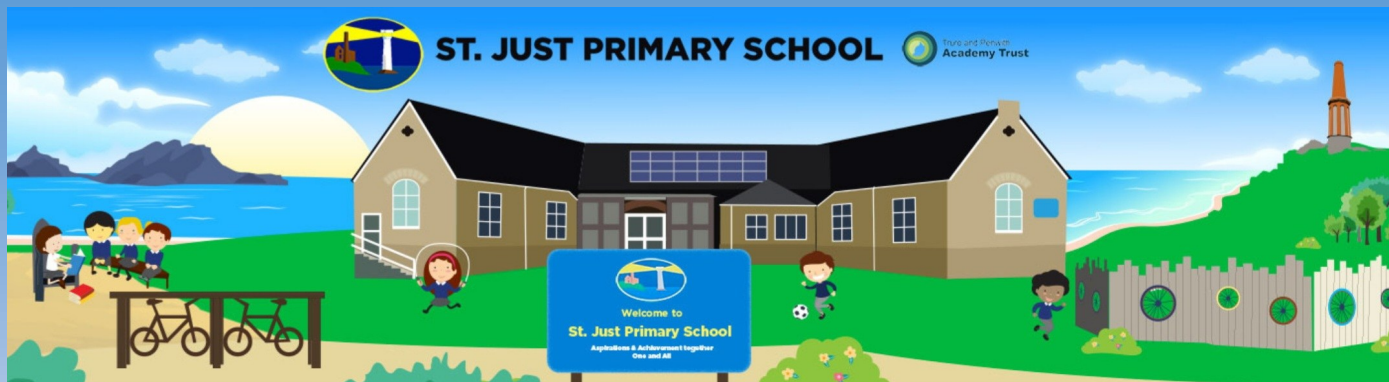

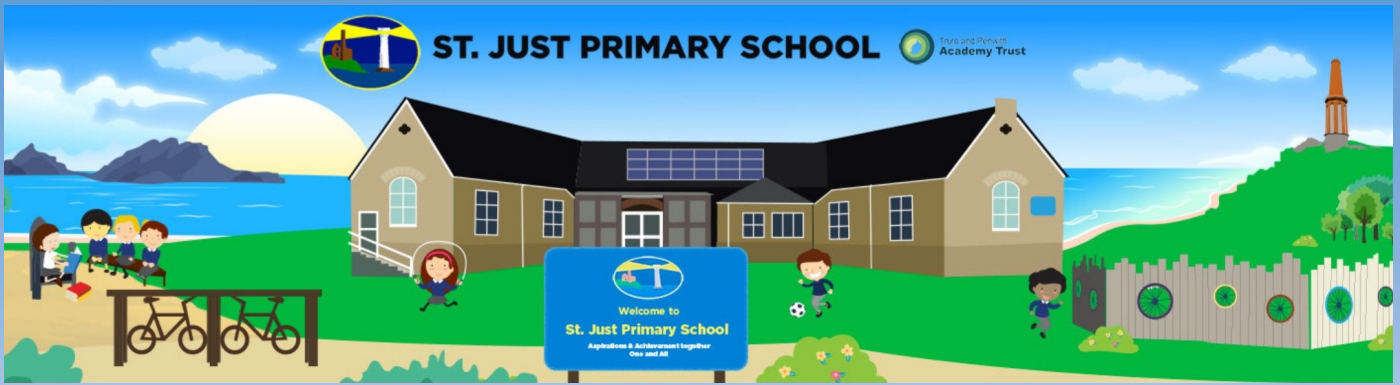


## Parents meetings in October
